Austria's Stille Nacht

The most famous Christmas song in the world, Stille Nacht (Silent Night) comes us from Austria. This beautiful to Christmas carol is now sung and enjoyed around the world in over 140 languages. The familiar melody we recognize today as **Stille Nacht** is not quite the same one that Franz Gruber composed. Although legend would have it that the original song was lost, the world-famous carol did take many years to become the well-known carol it is today. Around 1820 Joseph Mohr also wrote а Stille Nacht arrangement, but in 1845 new handwritten arrangements appeared by Franz Gruber— one for a full orchestra in 1845, and another for organ in 1855. By 1900 **Stille Nacht** had made its way around the entire globe. But let's go back to the beginning.

It was 1818, a cold Christmas Eve, when

Joseph Franz Mohr (1792-1848) walked three kilometers from his home in the Austrian village of *Oberndorf bei Salzburg* to visit his friend Franz Xaver Gruber (1787-1863) in the neighboring town of *Arnsdorf bei Laufen*.

Two years earlier Mohr had written a poem for which he now desperately needed a carol for the Christmas Eve midnight mass, only hours away. Mohr hoped his friend, a school teacher who also served as the church's choir master and organist, could set his poem to music. Amazingly, within just a few hours, Franz Gruber composed the melody for Mohr on that Christmas Eve Day in 1818. Due to recent flooding of the near-by Salzach River, the organ at St. Nicholas Church had been put out of commission; therefore, the music composed for quitar was accompaniment. (it is believed that this is the guitar Gruber used)



In the latter half of the 19th century, when the carol was beginning to become very popular, people assumed the melody must have been composed by a more famous composer, possibly Beethoven, Haydn, or even Mozart. Although Gruber had made a written claim as the composer prior to his death in 1863, doubts lingered on into the 20th century. Only several years ago it was officially settled when an arrangement of *Stille Nacht* was authenticated in *Joseph Mohr's* hand. In the upper right-hand corner of the arrangement Mohr had written the words, *Melodie von Fr. Xav. Gruber*.

Photo: H Flippo In Austria, *Stille Nacht* is considered a national treasure and traditionally the song may not be played publicly before Christmas Eve nor may the carol be used commercially. Contrast this with the situation in most other countries, where you are likely to hear *Silent Night* playing in the local shopping malls or even as part of radio or TV commercials. Nevertheless, *Silent Night* enjoys a revered position among Christmas carols all over the world, regardless what it may be called or in which language it may be performed.

Franz Gruber was born on 25 Nov. 1787 in the Austrian town *Hochburg*. He became a teacher and later moved to *Arnsdorf*. The rooms where he lived and worked can still be seen on the second floor of the Arnsdorf schoolhouse. Obviously, he did not spend all his time composing music: he fathered a dozen children by three different wives! In 1839 the Gruber family left Arnsdorf for Hallein, south of Salzburg. His grave lies next to the family's former home; annually it is adorned with a Christmas tree.

Joseph Franz Mohr, an illegitimate child, was born on 11 December 1792 in Salzburg. In August 1815, after receiving special papal dispensation required for illegitimate persons entering priesthood, he became a Catholic priest. Mohr died penniless after having donated his modest earthly fortune for education of the children in the community. In the tiny Alpine ski resort of Wagrain, the **Joseph** Mohr School stands only yards away from his final resting place as a fitting memorial of the man who wrote the words heard round the world.

The first-known performance of *Stille Nacht* in the United States took place near the Trinity Church in New York City. The Rainer family singers of Austria included the German version of *Stille Nacht* in their repertoire during an appearance at the Alexander Hamilton Monument in 1839, 24 years before an English version of the carol would be published.

The *Silent Night* English translation which we sing today, first appeared in 1863—the year Franz Gruber died, and about 45 years after the initial performance in Austria.

John Freeman Young, an Episcopalian

priest, enjoyed translating European hymns and carols into English. It is his 135-year-old *Silent Night* text that is found today in most hymnals and Christmas carol collections published in the English-speaking world.
